<sup>1</sup> "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. <sup>2</sup> For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.

## What does it mean to judge?

Not what people often mean today – saying someone is "sinning" or acting "immorally".

Real, biblical Christianity declares two things that make that definition of judging untenable:

- 1) There is such a thing as \_\_\_\_\_ truth (things that are true whether we agree with it or not.

**John 17:17** (NLT)

Make them holy by your truth; teach them your word, which is truth.

Jesus taught that when one of us moves away from what is true and right, we need to \_\_\_\_\_\_ them.

## Matthew 18:15 (NASB)

"If your brother sins, **go and show him his fault** in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother.

Paul confronted the Christians in Corinth because they weren't confronting someone caught in sin:

1 Corinthians 5:1-5

What does Jesus mean when He says "Do not judge"? Luke 6:37 (NIV)

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged. **Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned**. Forgive, and you will be forgiven.

The judging that Jesus is speaking of here is to have a critical condemning
It is to respond to someone (inwardly and often outwardly)love and grace.
